

# TE AWAMUTU INTERMEDIATE (2001)

## Enrolment Scheme

Effective from 27 January 2020

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

### Home Zone

**All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.**

Commence at the intersection of Jary Road and Ohaupo Road (SH3) and travel along Jary Road to Wallace Road. Ohaupo Road (SH3) from number 4652 is in zone. No Mill Road addresses are in zone. Turn left into Wallace Road and continue north into Turkington Road. Continue along Turkington Road to the intersection with Parallel Road. No Parallel Road addresses are included in the zone.

From the Turkington Road and Parallel Road intersection head south west to the Cox Road and Cambridge Road intersection. Cambridge Road to number 2959 is in zone. Turn left into Cox Road and continue to the intersection with Roto-o-rangi Road. Turn right into Roto-o-rangi Road and continue south to the intersection with Chamberlain Road and Parklands Road. Roto-o-rangi Road from number 937 is in zone.

Turn left into Parklands Road and continue south to the intersection with Ellicott Road and Monckton Road. All addresses on Cowan Road, Judge Road and Puahue Quarry Road are in zone. All addresses on Ellicott Road, Te Reti Road, Kahuwera Road and Koroko Road are also in zone.

Turn right into Monckton Road and continue south to Arapuni Road. At the intersection of Arapuni Road and Monckton Road head south to the intersection of Owairaka Valley Road and Bayley Road. Arapuni Road addresses to 1101 Arapuni Road are included in the zone. Owairaka Valley Road to number 331 is included in the zone.

At the Owairaka Valley Road and Bayley Road intersection follow Bayley Road to the intersection with Adams Road. Bayley Road addresses to number 46 are included in zone. Follow Adams Road then take a direct line west to end of Walker Road and into Settlers Road. Continue west to the intersection of Settlers Road and Wharepuhunga Road. No addresses on Nikau Road are in zone. Turn right onto Wharepuhunga Road and continue to the intersection with Otorohanga Road (SH3) and Te Kawa Road. Wharepuhunga Road addresses to number 96 are in zone. Otorohanga Road to number 645 is in zone.

From the Wharepuhunga Road, Otorohanga Road (SH3) and Te Kawa Road intersection continue west to the Ouruwhero Road and Martin Road intersection. All Hone Road, Martin Road and Te Oro Road addresses are included in the zone. Ouruwhero Road from number 817 is in zone. Continue directly west to the Waipa River.

Follow the Waipa River north to the intersection with Te Kawa Road. The zone takes in all addresses on Te Kawa Road and Tihiroa Road and from 1023 to 1218 Kawhia Road (SH39) before returning to the Waipa River.

Follow the Waipa River north to the bend in the river southeast of Pirongia, before it crosses SH39. Travel northeast to 690 Frontier Road. At 690 Frontier Road travel north east to the end of Johnson Road. Follow Johnson Road to Hawthorne Road, then left into Mangapiko School Road. All Johnson Road addresses are in zone. No Ryan Road addresses are in zone. Frontier Road to number 690 only is in zone.



At the intersection of Mangapiko School Road, Pirongia Road and Bowman Road, travel along Bowman Road to Paterangi Road. Head north to the end of Bank Road and onto Lake Ngारoto. Follow the southern shore of the lake west before heading west to Ohaupo Road and back to the starting point at the intersection of Jary Road and Ohaupo Road (SH3). Paterangi Road to number 909 is in zone. All addresses on Bank Road are in zone.

**Both sides of the in-zone roads above are included unless otherwise stated.**

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

### Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- First Priority** (This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary)
- Second Priority** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.
- Third Priority** must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
- Fourth Priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- Fifth Priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school, or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- Sixth Priority** must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

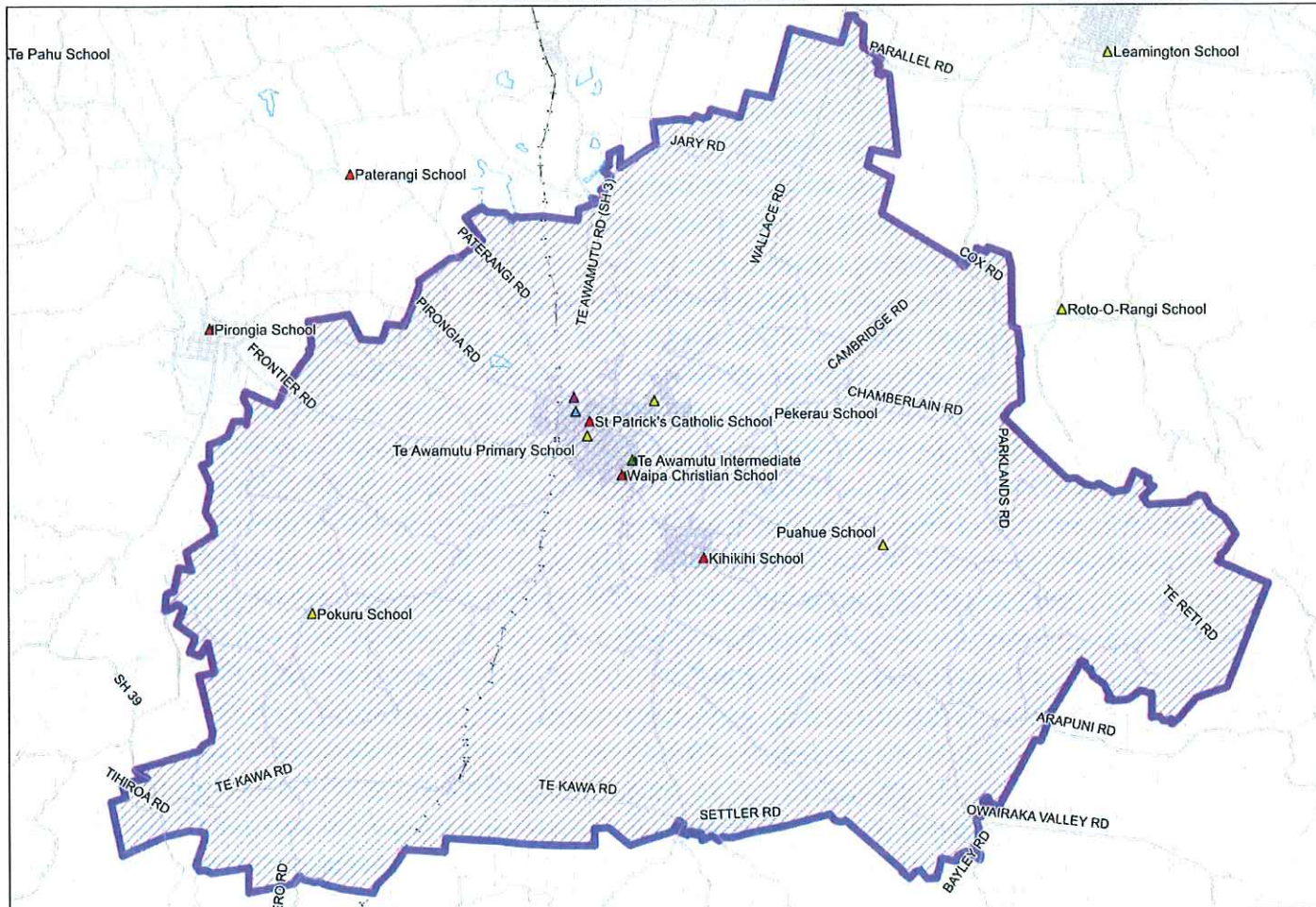


Figure 1: Boundary of the Te Awamutu Intermediate Enrolment Scheme Home Zone
